Angel Class





In Angel Class this term we have been doing lots of trips around the community and to the park. This has tied in with a sensory story we have been reading in the classroom - about taking trips on the bus. The learners thoroughly enjoy being out in the community and this is very beneficial for their social skills and emotional regulation. It also offers them a chance to improve on skills such as following instructions to keep themselves safe and interacting with each other and adults.





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Angel class have been doing lots of work around self-care routines this term. Including toileting, brushing teeth and dressing for the different seasons.

We have also been doing a lot of cooking this term, making pizzas, cupcakes, fruit salad and more. These activities have allowed our class to have increased exposure and exploration of different foods. The learners really enjoy following the steps of the recipe and helping to cut, mix and pour.









In literacy this term the learners have been enjoying different sensory stories with the learners themselves within the different stories. These stories incorporate different sensory elements to give the learners a fun and engaging experience. After the stories the learners take part in comprehension activities including writing and matching activities with relevant vocabulary from the story.







Victoria Class







Victoria's class this term has been learning about measurements and sizes, London landmarks by reading 'Maisy goes to London', listening and matching animal's sounds for phonics lesson and exploring things we can find in the air, water and land for science. We also, engage in mark making activities using different resources and messy play.

Now that the weather is getting nicer, we have loved going for walks, playing in the park and going on trips. We loved going to the Zoo and look the different London landmarks from the London Eye.









Pimlico Class

During the summer term, Pimlico class have enjoyed learning, exploring, discovering, and taking part in a range of lessons and activities.

Pimlico have loved engaging in music therapy sessions during which they have practiced playing a variety of instruments including the guitar, xylophone, and maracas.



In life skills, we have been working on developing functional skills including cooking, road safety awareness, going to the shops, and using public transport.



Pimlico have really enjoyed going out including to Parkland Walk, Alexandra Palace, and Priory Park.





In PE, we have been working on our co-ordination, core strength, balancing, and throwing through activities such as sensory circuits, hockey, scooter boards, group games, and stacking blocks.

In literacy, Pimlico have really enjoyed reading books and listening to stories whilst also working on their phonics awareness and use of language/symbols.

In numeracy, we have been learning about counting money and understanding directions when following a map which has come in handy during our trips to the local community!





In art, Pimlico have enjoyed developing their creativity skills through activities including painting, colouring in, cutting and sticking, exploring different textures, and messy play.



In science, we have been learning about different materials, sink and float, parts of the body, and parts of a leaf. We have also strengthened our ICT skills through engaging in activities on the interactive whiteboard, laptop, and iPad.




Paddington Class

Paddington have had a wonderful summer term, we've engaged in lots exciting learning, developed our skills, engaged and participated in lots of meaningful learning activities, and have worked hard toward and achieved our targets and AQA awards. We've enjoyed weekly music and cooking sessions and completed our class cooking book; it has lots of delicious and healthy recipes. We've gone for lovely community walks and have celebrated birthdays and special events. It's been a great school year overall for Paddington class. Well done everyone!



In Literacy our focus texts have been "Mr Men in London" and "Paddington at the Tower". We've done lots of comprehension and matching activities based on these books and have also been working on developing our writing and typing skills. Our morning phonics sessions have been really engaging and we've loved joining in with group games and activities. Our reading sessions have been very relaxing, and we've read, watched and listened to some really great stories.



In numeracy we've been using maps to follow directions, measuring and ordering different heights and lengths and working on our counting ability. We've enjoyed lots of walks in the community following different directions, we've measured who the tallest in the class is and have been able to recognise different sizes in the classroom and around school. We've really developed our skills and enjoyed numeracy games as a group.



In Science we've been learning about lots of different things and doing lots of fun experiments. We've learnt about the seasons, habitats, different careers in science, and solids and liquids. We've built structures, created sensory bags, and have done balloon and melting experiments it's been great!



In Art we've learned about lots of different topics and celebrated lots of different events. We created dragons and swords for St Georges Day, we created expressive art pieces for World Art Day, we made lots of cool habitats for World Species Day, made delicious biscuits to celebrate Wimbledon, and created beautiful bracelets for National Friend Day. We've been busy engaging in creative activities and celebrating fun days as a class.



During our RSE and PHSE we have been learning about safe people, personal space and touch, and different careers; whilst also developing our self-care, independence and life skills. Our independence has grown, and we are developing more of an understanding of the wider community.




Hampstead Class


During numeracy learning Hampstead have had opportunities at the interactive whiteboard and their work desks. We have been solving problems using skills such as matching, counting, number recognition and fine motor skills for example. We have had inspiration from London and The Mr. Men or Little Miss characters.



During Literacy our learners have had opportunities to enjoy reading as well as participating in phonics lessons. Learners have had a variety of picture books read to them as well as entry level reading books. This term phonics sounds have been eE, uU, rR, hH, bB, fF and IL.



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Hampstead class have enjoyed plenty of creative learning opportunities this term. We have made artwork based around the class sensory story for the term which was Mr. Men Little Miss in London by Roger and Adam Hargreaves. The story involves various Mr. Men and Little Miss characters taking a trip to London and seeing some of the very famous landmarks and attractions the city has to offer. Art has been inspired by these such as a making a crown fit for King Charles III, lion art inspired by the statues in Trafalgar Square and clock art inspired by Big Ben. We have also built 3D dioramas of the city.



Waterloo Class

Waterloo Class have had a great summer term completing targets and practicing our reading and writing skills. We especially made a lot of progress learning and incorporating new life skills. We had a lot of fun learning how to cross the road safely, learning how to cook different meals and learning how to use public transport safely. However, we had a particularly exciting time learning how to wash cars. Everyone was enthusiastic and playful from beginning to end. First, we created a poster to let everyone know about our car wash. Second, we had to ask our favourite teachers if we could clean their cars (for free of course!). Finally, we got to it. As you can see, we had a great time learning from the teachers and then doing it by ourselves. We even helped each other. Altogether, this life skills lesson was our favourite lesson and we have had a great year. Well done to everyone!





Life Skills

This summer term, our students have engaged in a variety of outdoor activities that emphasized essential life skills. Under the theme "Mind the Gap," we focused on teaching students the importance of road safety. They practised crossing streets safely, using pedestrian crossings, and securely riding buses. Some classes had the opportunity to travel on the underground and overground trains, allowing them to navigate public transportation with confidence and independence.





I am incredibly proud of our students for mastering the skills required to use public transport with the support of adults. Their progress in this area is a testament to their hard work and dedication. Notably, Paddington class had an excellent opportunity to participate in tennis lessons with a coach, which was a delightful addition to their learning experience.







In addition to learning about transportation, our students continued exploring different foods. They were encouraged to smell, touch, taste, and feel various foods and textures, which helped broaden their palates and promoted the inclusion of healthy foods in their diets. This sensory exploration was instrumental in making them more open to trying new and nutritious foods.
